LEVELS

Learn to Skate (LTS)

Snow Plow Sam and Basic 1-6

Junior Club

Passed Basic 6 through working on Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field

Senior Club

Passed Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field or Higher

SEASON LESSON INFORMATION

- 1 Hour Group Lesson by level with Coaches and Helpers

- Open skating time to practice skills at various times throughout the season
Parents must be present

- 30 minute individual lesson with club approved coach

- Open skating time to practice skills at various times throughout the season
Parents must be present during this time.

- Two 30 minute individual lessons with an available skater selected coach or coaches

- Open skate skill practice time during designated Senior Club ice times

Parents are required to stay during lesson times due to the skill level and age of the skaters

Optional Additional Individual Lesson Time during Junior Club Ice Time paid by skater

Optional Additional Individual Lesson Time:

During Junior or Senior Club Ice with Coach
(Junior Club Skaters cannot skate independently on Senior Club ice times for safety purposes)

Time is arranged with coach individually and paid by skater

Optional Additional Individual Lesson Time:

Private Individual Lessons with a Coach— Time is arranged with coach individually and paid by skater (not included in club ice fees)

TESTING

Testing occurs during group lessons
1 x per session (twice a year)

Testing occurs at various testing locations and is paid for by the skater. Skater also pays a fee to the coach for attending the test session. [Most common testing includes: Moves in the Field (MIF) and Free Skate]

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COACHES

- LTS Director Oversees Program and Assists Skaters & Coaches
- Coaches— 14+ yrs. of age, at Senior Club Level, and completed LTS certification course
- Helpers— 12+ yrs. of age & at Senior Club Level

Junior Club Coach **Minimum** Qualifications:

- 16+ yrs. of age, successfully coached LTS, completed shadowing of Senior Club coaches and Continuing Education Requirements (CER), and must carry insurance
- Has passed Juvenile Moves in the Field and Pre-Juvenile Free Skate

Senior Club Coach **Minimum** Qualifications:

- Has passed Intermediate Moves in the Field and Juvenile Free Skate testing or is grandfathered in as a coach
- Must carry insurance

PARENTS

Work 1 CFSC Bingo and Clean Rink During Designated Times, 0 Assessment Hours for 1st and 2nd year skaters, 25 Hours for 3-4 years and 40 Hours for 5th year skaters.

Work 2 CFSC Bingos, Clean Rink During Designated Times and Complete 40 Assessment Hours

Work 2 CFSC Bingos, Clean Rink During Designated Times and Complete 65 Assessment Hours

LEAP

Synchronized Skating

OVERVIEW

Our LEAP program is designed to help our skaters find success and excitement in figure skating. Your skater would be able to explore the different disciplines of figure skating to discover what interests them.

Our Synchronized Skating program is designed to teach skaters to skate to a routine in unison with other skaters. Skaters will learn how to work together with others while focusing on skating elements.

WHO

This program is geared to skaters in Basic 5, Basic 6, Junior Club, and younger Senior Club skaters who have passed Preliminary Moves In the Field.

This program is geared to skaters at all basic levels through those who have tested through Preliminary Moves In the Field.

WHAT

The focus is on an introduction to different disciplines of figure skating including:
 Artistry in Motion (Artistic), Ice Dance, Synchronized Skating, Interpretive Skating, Moves in the Field and Jumping & Spinning Patterns/Navigating Freestyle Sessions

A competition team is developed with skaters at similar skating levels from those skaters who have participated in synchronized skating sessions. The competition team consists of 8+ skaters who memorize and perform a routine.
