Practice Schedule: Practices will continue through April 4th (Dress Rehearsal- for ALL skaters) Please continue to look at the Google Sheet that was shared for practice updates and changes that may occur. SKATERS NEED TO BE AT THEIR PRACTICES (being absent from practices impacts the group's progress- please try to make it to every practice).

Skaters will be assigned a locker room by skating level, age and/or gender for the show.

Locker room assignments will be posted on the corresponding locker room door.

What might a skater need on show days?

- Blanket
 Cover Up (Bathrobe, Coat, Comfy etc.)
- Games or crafts for the locker room (no phones or electronic devices)
- Stain remover wipes Safety pins Snacks and clear drinks
- Hair and face products if desired Patience =)

Parent Information:

- Show parents are required to assist with set up and cleaning of the south rink the week leading up to the show, cleaning after each show and tear down after the final show on the 7th.
- 2. Skaters will need to be at Dress Rehearsal, Thursday, April 4th.
- 3. Parents of show skaters must sign up for a minimum of one job duty on one of the days of the show such as concessions, locker room supervisor, spot lighting, etc. If you have not already signed up, please click on the jobs link that was sent via email.


- O Have a positive attitude
- Assume best intentions

o If conflict arises, problem-solve respectfully with the individual you are having a conflict with first. If you need help, reach out to someone who can help you approach it in a calm manner. Send questions and concerns to the club email.


- Support our coaches. They put in an immense amount of time into the show and their numbers.
- o Remember that the show is about the skaters. Give skaters encouragement and compliments for their hard work. Be on time for practices.
 - Thank the people who are working hard to make this show a reality. While you may not agree with every decision, we want all skaters, parents and coaches to be respected.
- Please do not get on the ice until the clock says it is time for your group to start (or until the Zamboni doors are closed). This means not getting on early to warm up either, that can be done off ice.
- o Remember to stay with your group and listen to the coach since we have limited practice times.
- During "open" times LTS skaters may only be on at those times if they are in a private lesson.

Show Time: What You Need to Know

- Parents working the show need to be at the rink ready to begin 1 hour before their admissions, concessions, sound booth, flower sales and raffle shifts. Other shift areas need to be there 30 minutes prior to the start of the show. (FYI- Even if you are not working on a particular night, if you are able to assist during intermission in concessions please help out as this is a high volume time.)
 - Parents who are watching the show and not working will need to pay for admission (\$10 per ticket)
 - Blankets on the bleachers need to be removed once the show is complete to make way for cleaning.
 - All hands on deck to clean after each show is needed. Thank you for helping and doing your part.
 - ALL skaters need to be dressed and ready in their locker rooms 20 minutes before the show starts. (Friday 6:40pm, Saturday 4:40 pm & Sunday 12:40 pm)
 - Due to SafeSport (SkateSafe) parents or other adults are NOT allowed in the locker room of skaters who are 12+. The skaters are changing costumes and this needs to be honored so that they can change comfortably.
 - Locker room entrance for adults of skaters 11 years old or less is permitted by same sex adults. Opposite sex adults cannot be in the locker room while children who are not their own are changing into costumes.
 - 8. Skaters are able to sit with their adults at the show to watch but need to be in their assigned locker room and ready to go 3 show numbers before their own. There is a viewing area for skaters who are old enough to be respectful and responsible on their own on the far side of the bleachers.
 - Skaters should only have non-staining drinks and snacks while in the locker room and in their costumes. Blue Slushie = Blue Tongue which is perhaps not what you want your child's mouth looking like while performing.
 - Skaters should NOT walk on the bleachers with their skates, especially when someone is performing and when the show is being recorded.
 - Items your child might need: blanket, cover-up, safety pins for costume malfunctions, stain stick/stain remover, non-staining drinks & snacks, activities to do while waiting, etc.
 - HAVE FUN, CHEER LOUDLY, APPRECIATE THE POSITIVE THINGS YOUR SKATER AND OTHER SKATERS & COACHES HAVE ACCOMPLISHED.
